Father's Day is celebrating its 109th anniversary June 16, it began when Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington wanted to designate a day for her dad. Dodd's mother had died in childbirth, and Dodd's father, a Civil War veteran, had taken the responsibility of singlehandedly raising the newborn & his other 5 children.

The next year, the 1st Father's Day was celebrated June 19, 1910, as reported by the Spokane Convention & Visitor Bureau.

President Calvin Coolidge supported idea in 1924. President Lyndon Johnson issued the 1st presidential proclamation honoring fathers in 1966, but it wasn't until 1972 that President Richard Nixon signed the public law that made it a permanent holiday.
