

MAY DAYS

- May 1st also known as May Day, has been celebrated by children around the world when children dance around a May Pole.
- May 4, 1494 During his second journey of exploration in the New World, Christopher Columbus discovered Jamaica.
- May 5, 1961 Alan Shepard became the 1st American in space.
- May 11, 1888 Songwriter Irving Berlin was born in Tyumen, Russia. At the age of 4, he moved with his family to New York City & later began singing in saloons to help his family following the death of his father. Although he could not read or write musical notation, he became one of America's greatest songwriters.
- May 12, 1937 George VI was crowned at Westminster Abbey in London, following the abdication of his brother, Edward VIII. King George reigned until his death in 1952. He was succeeded by his daughter Elizabeth, the current reigning monarch.
- May 12, 1820 British nurse & health activist, Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy.

- May 17, 1875 The first Kentucky Derby horse race took place at Churchill Downs in Louisville.
- May 20, 1927 Charles Lindbergh, a 25-year-old aviator, took off at 7:52 a.m. from Roosevelt Field, Long Island, in the Spirit of St. Louis attempting to win a \$25,000 prize for the first solo nonstop flight between New York City and Paris. Thirty-three hours later, after a 3,600 mile journey, he landed at Le Bourget, Paris, earning the nickname "Lucky Lindy" and becoming a worldwide hero.
- May 20, 1932 Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic. She departed Newfoundland, Canada, at 7 p.m. and landed near Londonderry, Ireland, completing a 2,026-mile flight in 13 hours.
- May 21, 1881 The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton.
- May 24, 1844 Telegraph inventor <u>Samuel Morse</u> sent the first official telegraph message,
- May 29, 1917 <u>John Fitzgerald</u> <u>Kennedy</u> the 35th U.S. President was born in Brookline, <u>Massachusetts</u>.
